STAKEHOLDER BRIEFING: West Lancashire community health services procurement

Further to our previous updates on this re-procurement, we continue to take part dialogue discussions with those shortlisted potential providers.

To further provide opportunities for patients and local residents to speak to us directly about this process, we have arranged several patient/public involvement opportunities across West Lancashire. These will take place from 16-28 June 2016. CCG manned pop up stands will appear in local supermarkets, libraries and community centres and will allow for informal discussions to take place about the process itself and also for the CCG to hear more about experiences of using community health services.
